first edition and an entirely new  
selection of work from after 1986.  
Printed on bible paper and bound in  
leather, with gold debossing and edging,  
this volume looks and feels like a  
traditional bible, with no outward  
suggestion of what it contains. This  
revised and expanded Bible of Filth is  
the perfect introduction for newcomers,  
while retaining its status as an important  
collector's item for Crumb enthusiasts  
around the world.
